**San Diego County Crime Stoppers** and investigators from the San Diego Police Department's Traffic Division are asking for the public's help in identifying and locating the driver responsible for a fatal hit and run collision that occurred in the Ocean Beach area of San Diego.

*On June 4, 2020, at approximately 10:31 p.m., 25-year-old Cameron Loren was riding his skateboard westbound on the 4500 block of Voltaire Street, in the middle of the roadway. An unknown vehicle was traveling westbound on Voltaire Street and struck Loren from behind. The driver of the vehicle immediately drove away from the scene, leaving Loren on the roadway. Loren suffered fatal injuries as a result from the collision and he was pronounced deceased at the scene.*

#### Suspect's Vehicle Description:

Investigators believe the suspect's vehicle is a light colored sedan, which may have a damaged windshield and roofline.
